Question 1

1.1 Assessment of the social, physical and economic dynamics in communities

Read the scenario which is related to Annexure A: Community Map.

Annexure A: Community Map shows Esangweni community, ward number 128, which is made up of formal houses, some of which have informal structures added to them. These structures do not have indoor toilets. There are two mobile toilets, which are not cleaned often, that community members who live in these informal structures use.

The community has three big roads running through it. Mazibuko Street runs from the rail line which is on the one side of Tutu Avenue and leads away from Esangweni. There is a taxi rank at the corner of Robert Sobukwe Street and Mazibuko Street.

The secondary school, Esangweni Secondary is on the one side of the taxi rank. This school is across the road from the houses that have informal extensions. The SAPS office is on the other side of the taxi rank.

On the other side of Mazibuko Street, there are rows of houses. The SASSA office is next to the row of houses closest to Mazibuko Street. Esangweni Clinic, which is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, is next to the SASSA office across the street from the taxi rank.

There is a sports field in Esangweni. There are houses on two sides of the sports field. Esangweni Primary School is on the one side of the sports field, close to the SASSA office and Esangweni Clinic. The creche is around the corner from Esangweni Primary School, next to some houses. Children at the creche and Esangweni Primary School use the sports field during their school tea and lunch breaks.

No-one on the community has vegetable gardens. Most people buy food from food sellers at the taxi rank. Community members take the train to the nearby town to do their shopping.
