DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE REQUIRED:

The service provider will have the responsibility to:

- Liaise with CETs on the training of the identified unemployed learners (4 learners per province) in five provinces (Eastern Cape, Gauteng, Kwa-Zulu Natal, Limpopo, Northern Cape)
- Co-ordinate the registration of the learners with QCTO
- Coordinate all communication with the CETs regarding the training of the identified the learners
- Coordination and delivery of training in its entirety including training of Knowledge, Practical and workplace component
- Ability to train online or face to face or blended
- Administer all mandatory and compliance documents required by the HWSETA
- Provide the HWSETA will all required reporting documents
- Coordinate issuing of Statement of achievements, Statement of results and the certification of learners by the QCTO

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be accredited as a skills development provider by QCTO for the two occupational qualifications
- Co-ordinate and liase with the CETs on the registration of learners with QCTO
- Coordinate the placement of learners to write the External integrated Summative assessment (EISA) in an accredited assessment centre
- Assessment centre accreditation by QCTO or in the process of accreditation for the two
 occupational qualifications (evidence required)
- The ability to train in the five different provinces as learners will be from different provinces

- Provide a Mock project plan on how the training will be rollout in the five provinces
- 2 years' experience in training against any of the above areas. References are required.
- Must have a minimum of 5 years or more of experience in the training space
- Provide a budget breakdown for training that is inclusive of tuition and transport allowance for 20 learners using the HWSETA guidelines and maximum costs per learner.
- Training must be completed by no later than **15 February 2026**.
